Annual Information Meeting

Tuesday, July 21, 2020 to be held electronically on Zoom after the Municipal Development Plan Public Hearing at 6:00 p.m. The annual picnic has been cancelled.

Public Works:



Front Entrance Signs: The signs were refinished to make them look sharper and last longer. In addition, dead plants were removed and new perennials installed.

Road: There will be additional road work completed this year to help get it back in more solid shape including repairing the frost boils, adding gravel and applying dust control.

Road Centre Piece (Island): The old timbers will be replaced with concrete curbs; in addition the stump will be removed and an additional rock placed in the centre of the area.

Stormwater: There have been concerns with stormwater in the Summer Village. Council, Administration and two professional engineers from McElhanney walked Itaska Beach to review the roads and ditching around Itaska Beach. A great outcome from the walkthrough was that while there was originally a plan to install bioswales in paths leading down to the lake, there are already natural bioswales established.

There is flooding around the park which will be reviewed further. McElhanney has been hired to complete an elevation charting and design drawing to understand stormwater currently flowing through Itaska Beach, from surrounding areas into Pigeon Lake and present options to address areas prone to localized flooding. Depending on the results, a pilot trial may be completed this fall in coordination with approval from Leduc County and the Audubon Society, as the water flow affects the whole area.

All of this work is able to be funded through the Provincial MSI Capital grant program.

Council:

At the organizational Council Meeting, David Alton was appointed Mayor, and Rex Nielsen as Deputy Mayor. Thanks to all Council for their continued service and dedication to the Summer Village.

Leaf Pickup

Scheduled for Tuesday, October 13, 2020. The leaves must be placed in a **clear** bag at the end of your driveway. Any material other than leaves or not in a clear bag will not be picked up and will be your responsibility to dispose of.

Regular Garbage Pickup:

Weekly garbage collection will continue until October 26, 2020. After that it will be on a bi-weekly basis.

Extra Garbage:

For additional garbage that does not fit in your garbage bin, it must be disposed of in an acceptable dump facility. If you would like to take it to the Sunnybrook Transfer Station, you can purchase a one-time access card for \$20 from the Summer Village Office. Send us an e-transfer and we can mail you out the card(s).

Emergency Services Fees

Be aware of the costs of fire emergency services. While the Summer Village has contracted for the service to be available to your residence, it does not cover the call out fees. Contact your insurance broker to determine if call out fees are covered in your policy. Note that there are fees for any call out, examples include: False alarms, fires, medical first aid.

Fortis Vegetation Control

Fortis contractors will be clearing trees from right of ways in the area. This project will take about 18 months to complete. Representatives will be in contact with you if it affects your property. If you have any questions or concerns please call 310-WIRE.

Municipal Development Plan (MDP)

Pursuant to the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.A. 2000, c. M-26, as amended, Sections 230, 606, and 692, the Council of the Summer Village of Itaska Beach hereby gives notice of its intention to adopt:

Bylaw No. 11-2020 Summer Village of Itaska Beach Municipal Development Plan

The purpose of the Bylaw is to approve a new Municipal Development Plan (MDP).

The **MDP** is a high-level planning document that guides the long-term land use planning for the community and will provide direction for other land management and development policies created for the Summer Village.

The MDP:

- 1. Includes information about the community history, current demographics, and environmental features;
- 2. Includes mapping information to identify areas with development constraints:
- 3. Identifies preferred future land use areas for residential, recreation and environment land uses;
- 4. Establishes high level land use and land management goals and objectives;
- 5. Establishes policies affecting:
 - a. Cooperation with agencies and neighbouring municipalities;
 - b. The manner and proposals for future development;
 - c. All land use and development activities in the Summer Village;
 - d. Development in the specific land use areas;
 - i. Development that may impact Pigeon Lake and its watershed, including: stripping and grading, site coverage, vegetative cover, development setbacks;
 - e. Development in environmentally significant areas;
 - f. Development in areas with environmental constraints (e.g., high water table, steep slopes, etc.)
 - g. Development of infrastructure and transportation systems.
