SUMMER VILLAGE OF ITASKA BEACH POLICY #2

Solid Waste Management

- 1. It is the Policy of the Summer Village to encourage ratepayers to minimize the amount of materials that they are sending to Landfill Sites. Minimization practices include the use of recycling depots for items such as old TV's, computers, monitors, paper, cardboard and liquid containers, and the use of composting practices for biodegradable materials such as grass clippings and leaves.
- 2. It is the Policy of the Summer Village to provide the following:
 - a) A Solid Waste Landfill site to receive all solid waste from the municipality. The Summer Village has a long term contract with Camrose County at their West Dried Meat Lake landfill site. (available to all Summer Village ratepayers).
 - b) A garbage collection and hauling service from properties with a dwelling. The Summer Village has a five-year contract, effective April 1, 2007, with a contractor to provide this service.
 - c) A large bin will be provided twice yearly: during the May long and September long week-end for ratepayers to do clean-outs of their cabins, while following the restrictions for containerized storage bins located in the Solid Waste Management Bylaw #2007-02.
 - d) Grass collection during the summer months, with a limit of 4 bags per household, no bag to exceed 50 lbs in weight, and the grass MUST be in clear bags. As the grass will be composted, there can be NO garbage, branches, twigs. The Summer Village has a one-year contract, effective May 1, 2007, with a contractor to provide this service.
- 3. It is the Policy of the Summer Village to not provide the following:

This Policy adopted by Council Resolution this 20th day of June, 2007.

A collection and hauling service of all other types of solid waste, including but not limited to: construction refuse, household hazardous waste, paint, solvents, dead animals, old furniture and appliances, compostable materials, etc.
